TWITTER HELPS TURKISH CITIZENS TWEET DESPITE BAN

Hours after Turkey banned Twitter for news, photos and videos that were posted on the site about the country, the hashtag #TurkeyBlockedTwitter became one of the trending tags across the world. More surprising than that, Twitter has told as many Turkish users as possible that not only can they still post through mobile devices, but there is an alternate DNS IP address which will allow users to access the site.

The alternate DNS has been graffitied and passed off throughout Turkey, and an image on Twitter has been flashing saying "Keep Calm", followed by the alternate DNS. By the next morning following the ban, the people of Turkey has posted more than 2.4 million tweets.

Data from Twitter and the social media agency, We Are Social says that the ban on Twitter actually encouraged more people from Turkey to tweet messages. Robin Grant, the global marketing director from We Are Social, stated:

It appears people in Turkey are enjoying the challenge, tweeting via text message, through an anonymous VPN, by changing their DNS and it seems even those who may have had little interest in tweeting before are now getting involved. As numerous politicians all over the world have discovered to their detriment in



the past, it's not clever to pick a fight with social media. It's not one they're likely to win.
