We all know the tune of the ice cream truck. As kids, it's the tune that used to make us drool and immediately beg our parents for a few dollars, just so we could track, then chase the truck down.

In the Swedish town of Eslov, the residents are complaining that the tunes played by ice cream trucks are distracting and are demanding the music stop.

Engelholm, the local ice cream truck company says that because of these complaints, they will drive the trucks in silence. No more music for children to use as a tracking method to find their favourite summertime treat.

Instead, a text message will be sent to houses close to the location of the ice cream truck. The company says that a letter will be dropped off at every house giving the option to have their number added to the system. If they do not give permission, there will be no text message given when the truck is nearby, so no ice cream for those residents.

IPADS IN SCHOOLS A GOOD IDEA?

With the amount of technology available to kids everyday, Canadian researches wondered about how technology would work in the classroom. iPads are starting to make an appearance in classrooms, but are they working to help teach?

The survey of over 6000 students between grades 6 to 10, and 300 teachers suggested that iPads or other tablets were a worthwhile investment, provided they are used properly, and the teachers are prepared for the switch in teaching method. Of the teachers surveyed, only 30% of teachers said they had previously used an iPad, as opposed to the 46.4% of their students. Because of this, many teachers ended up still figuring out their iPad the first day of school, while their students were already on Facebook or playing Candy Crush. In fact, one third of the students surveyed confessed to playing games during school hours or in class.

Research also showed that the iPads were not being used to their full potential. Many students said that they rarely used the iPads for reading, and the majority of assignments were still needing to be handed in by paper means. About 85% also said they never or rarely used the iPads to do written work.

Out of school, the students said 76% of time, the tablets were used for either social media or for gaming. With time being also being spent in class on things other than schoolwork, it very easy to say the tablets are more a distraction than a teaching aide. However, on a scale of 1 to 5 of the helpfulness of the iPad as a teaching tool, teachers rated it as a 3, while the students rated it at a 3.5.
