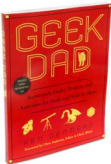

Startup Company Raffles a Ticket to Space

Although no spaceflight companies have made a commercial flight, and it may not happen for many years, that day is approaching, and one startup company is getting in on the ground floor. “I Dream of Space”, a new startup company, is selling 25,000 space posters for \$10 each. Each poster comes with an entry for a chance to win a trip to outer space. The proceeds made from the posters, should cover a \$200,000 ride on Virgin Galactic’s SpaceShipTwo or a \$95,000 seat on XCOR Aerospace’s Lynx, plus some profit for the company, of course.

Company co-founder Reuben Metcalfe of New Zealand, states “Given the kind of progress we’re seeing with these companies, and the customers lining up, it’s going to happen soon. If companies continue building the way they are building, and we build a robust community, it’s going to pan out.”

Metcalfe states he’s already begun discussing several options with suborbital spaceflight companies. However he states his company needs to raise a \$20,000 deposit before they take him seriously, and when that happens, the companies still have to prove that they can routinely fly customers to suborbital altitudes and safely return them to the ground.

“I Dream of Space” has already attracted hundreds of poster-buying, astronaut-wanna-bes, and they hope to sell the remaining contest entries by the end of 2012. Metcalfe and his partners hope to stage similar opportunities in 2013 and 2014, depending on the success of the current endeavour.

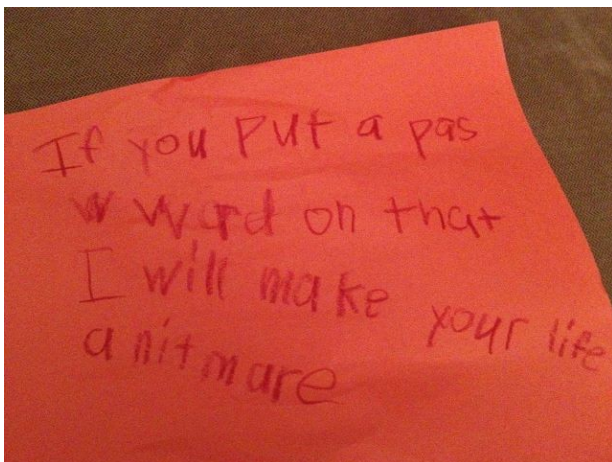

Foil Hat Not Included

You've heard all the warnings and suggestions on how to avoid having your Wi-Fi hi-jacked. However, if your Wi-Fi is still not secured, or if your password is...password, help is on the way!

Researchers from Institut Polytechnique Grenoble and the Centre Technique du Papier obviously had you in mind when designing their new handy-dandy, Wi-Fi-blocking wallpaper which they have called “Metapaper”.

Although Wi-Fi-blocking wallpaper is not a new concept, this is the first one that is reputed to be marketed to the commoners amongst us. The Finnish company Ahlstrom states that when they launch this product next year, they expect it to cost “equivalent to that of a classic mid-range cost wallpaper”.

Smartphones texting, calling, mobile data, etc. apparently work with the wallpaper, and only a handful of Wi-Fi frequencies are blocked.

The bad news is, if you just cover your walls with the wallpaper (what a novel idea!), Wi-Fi signals could leak out through the non-covered surfaces—namely your roof, floor and windows.
